#### ISSUE

Washington State faces digital inequities, including:

- insufficient broadband access
- limited devices
- lack of essential digital skills



**Geographic Disparities**Limited broadband access in rural and remote areas.



**Socioeconomic Barriers** Affordability issues for low-income communities.



Cultural & Linguistic Exclusion Challenges for non-English speaking and diverse communities.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

#### **Data Sovereignty**

Promoting digital sovereignty to empower communities with control over their digital narratives.

#### **Community Representation**

Prioritizing community representation to authentically capture diverse digital experiences.

#### Non-Extractive

Aiming for non-exploitative practices to honor and protect community voices and data.

#### **MEET OUR TEAM**


- You or your organization may wish to work with Joyce or staff from Inclusive Data (our partner).

#### **KEY TAKEAWAYS**

### **Community Compensation for their Lived Experience**

Community members will be compensated for their time and expertise. Compensation runs from \$25-\$200 depending on the type and length of the activity.

- When written materials need translating or other work will be done by community members, we plan to subcontract those community members to pay them for that work so the translation and activities are truly local to the community.
- If co-creation activities are happening at an event, there is funding for food, transportation, and childcare in addition to compensation for community members' expertise.

### What Are (Some) Types of Stories We Are **Curious About So Far?**

- Do you have access to faster broadband internet?
- Do you have any internet devices? If so, do they suit your needs?
- How does the internet (or skills) affect your ability to meet your goals?
- Who do you trust to help you with technology and skills?
- Do you feel safe and confident navigating the digital world?
- What aren't we already asking but is important to your experience and quality of life?
- We are looking to tell a holistic story of how the digital world impacts quality of life and what solutions are developed in community to support one another where inequities exist.
